Talk 1: Literature and Place (22 April 2017)

The vast New Territories contributes to the preservation of traditional Chinese culture to a great extent. This talk aims at introducing the historic landmarks and architecture of the region in literary works and their literary representations.

Talk 3: Hong Kong Island (8 July 2017)

Hong Kong Island, the political and economic centre in the past colonial period, remains the imprint of European culture. Based on the historic landmarks and architecture portrayed in literary works, this talk will illustrate the coexistence of Chinese and Western culture in Hong Kong literature.

Compared to New Territories and Hong Kong Island, Kowloon is full of liveliness of urban dwellers. This talk will focus on the historic landmarks and buildings in literary works, bringing the audience to revisit the hustle and bustle of the complex city life.
