

'Monumental' Stories — Cat Curator Colouring Competition

Meow! It's story time! Are you sitting comfortably? Then let's listen to some fascinating stories about antiquities and monuments that you won't have heard before! The Antiquities and Monuments Office (AMO) has invited the story-telling cat who always appears at the Hong Kong Heritage Discovery Centre to be our "Cat Curator", and it's going to share with you some stories about the antiquities and historic buildings in Hong Kong to help you get a better understanding and appreciation of our city's cultural heritage.

Today, Cat Curator will join you to appreciate four historic buildings which have been declared as monuments that are being or was used for teaching. They are Kang Yung Study Hall, a traditional Chinese private study hall; the Former Kowloon British School built for foreign children; The Main Building of The University of Hong Kong, the starting point for the development of local higher education in the last century; and Bonham Road Government Primary School, which was the former campus of the first teacher training college in Hong Kong. All primary school students are welcome to join the competition!

Rules of the Competition

1. Purpose

Through schools, to encourage students to learn outside classroom about Hong Kong's declared monuments that are being or was used for teaching so as to enable them to have a better understanding and appreciation of our cultural heritage.

2. Eligibility

All primary school students in Hong Kong are eligible for participating in the competition individually.

3. Division

Junior Primary Division: P1 - P3
 Senior Primary Division: P4 - P6

4. Competition Format

 Students can download one of the colouring pages from the AMO's website on https://www.amo.gov.hk/, and print it out on an A4 paper (210mm x 297mm).



They can then colour on the paper using any drawing tools, paints and crayons
they like and also add other elements using their imagination. 3D paintings,
computer graphics and computer-generated images will <u>NOT</u> be accepted.

6. Judging Criteria

- Colouring skills and use of colour (30%)
- Creative features (30%)
- Overall artistic appearance (40%)

7. Prizes

The following prizes will be awarded in each division:

- Champion: trophy, certificate of merit and book coupon worth HK\$1,000
- 1st runner-up: trophy, certificate of merit and book coupon worth HK\$800
- 2nd runner-up: trophy, certificate of merit and book coupon worth HK\$500
- Ten merit awards: certificate of merit and book coupon worth HK\$300

8. Submission

- Students can download the entry form and colouring pages from https://www.amo.gov.hk/ for joining the competition. After completing their entries, participants should pass them to their respective schools for submission to AMO. Entries submitted in any other ways will NOT be accepted.
- Schools can submit the school entry form together with the entries to the Hong Kong Heritage Discovery Centre (address: Kowloon Park, Haiphong Road, Tsim Sha Tsui, Kowloon) by 6:00 pm on <u>21 April 2023</u>.
- If submitted by post, please mark on the envelope ['Monumental' Stories Cat Curator Colouring Competition] and affix sufficient postage before submission. AMO will not accept items with insufficient postage, which will be returned to Hong Kong Post. In addition, AMO does not assume responsibility if entries are lost, folded or damaged during posting and delivery.
- Participants who submitted more than one entry will be disqualified.



9. Submission Deadline

6:00 p.m. on **21 April 2023**, Friday (post chop by Hong Kong Post for posting submission and AMO's chop for delivery by hand).

10. Announcement of Result

The list of winners will be released on the AMO's website in June 2023. Winners will be notified on the arrangements for collecting the prizes by email.

11. Terms and Conditions

- Participants must carefully read all the information, and terms and conditions of the competition. By submitting the entry form, the participant agrees to observe and accept all the terms and conditions of the 'Monumental' Stories – Cat Curator Colouring Competition (the "competition"). The organiser reserves the rights to disqualify participants who violate the terms and conditions.
- There is no limit to the number of entries submitted by each school, but each individual participant can only submit **ONE** entry.
- The organiser will not return the entries to schools after the competition. Participants are advised to make copies for themselves.
- The organiser has the rights to keep and use the entries (in any form, including digital) for publication, exhibition or promotional purposes, including uploading entries onto its website, without prior consent of the schools and participants.
- An entry as a whole, including the style, design, composition and content, must be the original work of the participant and must not infringe any intellectual property rights of any individuals and institutions.
- The organiser has the rights to reject or disqualify any entry without explanation; any dispute will be subject to the final decision of the adjudication panel.
- The organiser has the rights to amend the rules at any time without prior notice.
